





A BIG SALVIE TO THE MASTER BLASTER: SACHIN TENDULKAR

SACHIN RAMESH TENDULKAR is a former Indian Cricketer, popularly holds the title "god of cricket" among his fans. He started his career from the age of 11. He is the only cricketer to have scored 100 international centuries; he is also the first batsman to score a double century in a One Day International, and the only player to complete more than 30,000 runs in international cricket.

He was born on 24th April 1973 in Bombay (Maharashtra). He was married to Anjali on 24th May 1995 and they have two kids Sara and Arjun.

In his cricket career he was given different nicknames such as tendlya, god of cricket, little master, master blaster, etc. His test match debut was on 15th November 1989 against Pakistan. His Last test match was on 14th November 2013 against West Indies. His first ODI match was on 18th December 1989 against Pakistan and last ODI match was on18th March 2012 again against Pakistan.

In 2002, wisden cricketers' Almanack ranked him the second greatest test batsman of all time, behind Don Bradman and the second Greatest ODI batsman of all time, behind Viv **Richards**

In 2012, Tendulkar was nominated to rajyasabha, the upper house of the parliament of India. He was also the first sportsperson (and the first without an aviation background) to be awarded the honorary rank of group captain by the Indian Air Force. In 2012, he was named an honorary Member of the Order of Australia.

In December 2012, Tendulkar announced his retirement from ODIs. He retired from T20 cricket in October 2013 and subsequently announced his retirement from all forms of cricket, retiring on 16th November 2013 after playing his 200th and final test match against West Indies in Mumbais' Wankhede stadium. Tendulkar Played 664 international cricket matches in total, scoring 34,357 runs.

HARMONY: Anil tell us about your entire journey from being a radio jockey to CEO of Meow to Radiowalla, I am sure it wouldn't have been easy what all difficulties did you face and how did you overcame them?

ANIL SRIVATSA: This can become a long answer as the journey was long and if I have to do justice to my journey, you would have successfully made me write my first book. Professionally this journey has been recorded in my work experience section of my FB profile facebook.com/anil.srivatsa or http://about.me/anilsrivatsa

As for the challenges part and the difficulties I overcame all of them with just these acquired and practiced qualities. Dignity of labour so was willing to take on any work to survive (Legal of course), a highly positive attitude, self belief, believed in doing something about a challenge rather than the challenge doing me, never straying the right path and an undying faith in the cosmic forces and power most people refer to faith in god all topped with the internal desire to do something that makes a change for more people than just my immediate circle. Make a difference to others while you walk this earth.

HARMONY: Currently Radiowalla is doing pretty well. What do you think is the future of online radio station in coming days, do you think there are going to be couple of competitors in the coming years?

ANIL SRIVATSA: My first internet radio station that I started was in 1998 and have never looked back ever since. I think the future of radio content consumed via the internet is definitely the future as bandwidth availability and cost come down. The perfect medium to deliver special interest content as a very low cost and wider reach as the internet is global and very much mobile.

HARMONY: Not just us but there were a lot of fans who were disheartened after Meow discontinued, what was the reason behind Meow closing its shutters?

ANIL SRIVATSA: This was an ownership decision to change the format on 104.8 FM from a women only talk radio format to the current format of Oye! I think that was shortsighted on their part but it was their prerogative. Quick financial gain was the reason for this and they felt Meow was not getting enough listeners. But my argument was that a format such a meow would take time and when it did, it will be format to challenge other music stations. Of course no one listened to me and we both left.

HARMONY: We all know how conservative the Indian society has been all along, but when we talk about your most famous radio series "Between the Sheets" a lot of participation is there, people come and talk about things that they never used to, do you think it's just because no one can identify them on a radio show (well I've personally identified couple of my friends on your show just by how they talk, and even I've been identified twice) or is it about the Indian society now shifting from a very closed and shy one to an open minded and expressive one?

ANIL SRIVATSA: Indian society is still closed and shy in comparison to others or forward in comparison to some. But what radio has allowed is the open, honest exchange of ideas in the comfort of radios anonymity. The show did well because of its fresh approach and bold approach to very contemporary issues relating to love, sex and relationships. Discussion between the sheets were always happening but in hushed tones in small groups but what this show did was to widen the platform and made it ok to speak about some of the most important moments and feeling of a human beings life.

HARMONY: Starting India's first LGBT radio channel was a great effort, do you think LGBT community in India is suffering due to the vague Acts which have been incorporated in the constitution ? What is your message for everybody out there as to how the LGBT community should be treated in India or in any part of the world for that matter?

ANIL SRIVATSA: This is a matter of respecting human rights and their right to choose who they love as long as it is not forced on anyone. This should not be a criminal act in our society. This could always remain as a moral debate as are other choices people make with regards to love and relationships. I think this law is outdated and is in gross violation of the human rights provisions of our law and good citizenship.

HARMONY: Your innovative ideas have always knocked my socks off. Meow, Between the Sheets, Radiowalla, LGBT channel they all have been such wonderful and great ideas and each one of them have helped a lot of people in some or the other way. So, where do you get all this inspiration for such innovative ideas?

ANIL SRIVATSA: Just a couple of things:-

- A. I believe everyone has the right to express themselves and to be heard and I will protect everyone's right to do so even if I disagree with them.
- B. I want to effect change in attitudes and thinking and behavior for the greater good and I have chosen the path of radio communication to do so. I believe radio has the power to reach into the depths of people's hearts and minds.

HARMONY: What are you planning to do next? Is anything else lined up right now?


ANIL SRIVATSA: More channels and more show that cater to the special interest groups with even more special content on the radiowalla.in platform.

A la carte

The Venice offers a marvelous variety of cuisine and drinks to suit all tastes. Some local specialties include 'Polenta', boiled maize served in slices, Tiramisu and 'Prosecco', a typical Venetian aperitif of Campari and water. Fish and seafood lovers should head to the fishing village of Cortellazzo, and the piazzas in Lido di Jesolo provide restaurants offering every conceivable type of food.

Language

Locally spoken Veneziano is an actual language but Venetian, Italian and English are also spoken.

Beaux Art (Architecture)

Gothic art is easily recognisable to visitors on the facades of many buildings. Officially, there is just one palace in Venice-Palazzo Ducale: the buildings, modestly called "Casa" by the nobles and wealthy citizens. Casa are very similar to palaces. The Ca'd'Oro has been probably the most famous Palace facade in late Gothic style. But a number of churches, like the Santa Maria Gloriosa dei Frari and the Santi Giovanni e Paolo, also number among the greatest examples of the late Gothic period in Venice.

Renaissance art in Venice

Architecturally speaking, not much changed in Venice during the Renaissance – at least in the area of sacred architecture. To be mentioned here are only the facades of Il Redentore, San Francesco and San Giorgio Maggiore churches, which the famous master Palladio designed himself. However, during this period many Renaissance palaces were built by wealthy families, who could afford them thanks to the wealth of the trading power of Venice. The influence of the Renaissance on painting was considerably more important. Great artists such as Jacopo and Gentile Bellini, Giorgione, Titian, Tintoretto and Paolo Veronese supplied the Doge and the numerous churches, noblemen and wealthy citizens with their works of art.



Masks have always been a main feature of the Venetian carnival. As masks were also allowed on Ascension and from October 5 to Christmas, people could spend a large portion of the year in disguise. Mask makers (mascherari) enjoyed a special position in society, with their own laws and their own guild. There is little evidence explaining the motive for the earliest mask wearing in Venice. One scholar argues that covering the face in public was a uniquely Venetian response to one of the most rigid class hierarchies in European history. Near the end of the Republic, the wearing of the masks in daily life was severely restricted. By the 18th century, it was limited only to about three months from December 26.



Pio De Joneiro is the most beautiful city of Brazil, surrounded by lovely hills and beaches. Many people travel to the city for its famous beaches like Copacabana and Ipanema. 

Eucharist (Religion)

- There are many extremely well-preserved mosques in Cairo that are still in use by the city's Muslim population. These include the ninth century Mosque of Ibn-Tulun and the enormous 19th century Muhammad Ali Mosque.
- Just outside of the city lie some of the most iconic architectural structures in the world: the Great Pyramids at Giza and the Sphinx. These are artifacts from the Dynastic Age of Egypt, and for natives of Cairo provide a concrete link to the extensive history of their culture.

cuisine

- Cairo is located just north of the lush Nile River Valley, and the cuisine makes extensive use of fresh vegetables.
- Bread is the core of any meal in Cairo, and the standard bread is a thick form of pita. ٠ Bread is such an integral part of the Egyptian diet that it is subsidized by the government, and bread lines can be seen throughout Cairo.
- Many of the foods seen in Cairo can be seen throughout the Middle East, including baba ghanoush, tahini, and falafel. The most iconic dish in Cairo is kushari, which is made with macaroni noodles, lentils and rice.

Art and Music


- Cairo has an electric range of art and music, some dating back thousands of years. ٠

In truth, the swastika has been found on objects from as early as 4,000-10,000 B.C. The Indus valley civilization religions of Hinduism ,Buddhism and Jainism still use the symbol to signify either divine auspiciousness or the sun's rays. In Buddhism, some believe a swastika was stamped on Buddha's chest when he was buried, known as the Heart's Seal.



STAR OF DAVID :

South Indian temples dating back thousands of years have hexagrams adorning their exteriors. The Hindus hold the hexagram as a mandala and use it to represent the heart chakra. In the ancient Tibetan Book of the Dead, there are images of a swastika inside the hexagram representing the creative force in the universe.

YIN YANG:

A Chinese picture of universal harmony and the unity between complimentary opposites: light/dark, male/female, etc. Yin is the dark, passive, negative female principle. Yang is the light, active, positive principle. Since the holistic balance between Yin and Yang is dynamic and constantly changing, it illustrates the consensus process, the vision of global unity, and the blending of opposing energies at the heart of Holistic Health.



Sanskrit letters or symbol for the "sacred" Hindu sound om (ohm or aum) called "the mother of all mantras. Apparently, the four parts symbolize four stages of consciousness: Awake, sleeping, dreaming, and a trance or transcendental state.



Called "the devil's pitchfork," it has symbolized major gods in various pagan cultures. In India, it is linked to the Hindu "trident-bearer" Shiva, spouse of the skull-bearinggoddess Kali. More recently, this threesponged spear has been used by Hindu militants in India to intimidate Christians

Promoting Gender equality and empowerment of women is one among the eight millennium development goals set to be achieved by 2015. India is on a race against time to meet this goal on a lot of fronts.

India's poor performance on women's empowerment and gender equality is reflected in many indicators. In many parts of the country, sex ratio has dropped to fewer than 850 females per 1000 males. India is ranked 132 out of 148 countries on Gender Inequality Index as per the 2013 Global Human Development Report. Women from disadvantaged groups and minorities in particular face discrimination, exploitation and limited employment opportunities.

India missed the 2005 deadline of eliminating gender disparity in primary and secondary education. However, the country has hastened progress and the Gender Parity Index (GPI) for Gross Enrolment Ratios (GER) in primary and secondary education has risen. Given current trends, India is moderately or almost nearly on track. However, "participation of women in employment and decision-making remains far less than that of men, and the disparity is not likely to be eliminated by 2015." We need to understand and embrace the importance of gender equality. And emphasize the positive contributions women make to families, society and the nation as a whole. And there is a great importance of men's leadership in the movement to promote women empowerment.

In keeping with the Millennium Development Goals and bringing about a transformational change to ensure that women have a real voice in governance institutions at all levels, that they have equal participation in public dialogue and influence the decisions that will determine the future of their families and communities. resulting sustainable human development. When a woman is empowered, she ensures her family is educated, healthy and has a better economic status and this translates to the society, the district and the nation at large, so let us pledge to act to empower women for a sustainable economic development.

中國的 傳統(CHINESE TRADITION)

INTRODUCTION

Chinese have been recorded using ideographs. China has witnessed translation and interpreting activities as early as Zhou Dynasty, over 3000 years ago from now. Major Chinese translator's work has always been in government and commerce.

BEGINNING OF TRANSLATION

Translation activities in China started during spread of Buddhism. The translation of Buddhist sutras, in the first wave, from Sanskrit into Chinese can be divided into three phases.

Phase I: Word to word translations, adhering to source language syntax.

Phase II: Syntactic inversions were smoothened according to target language, and polished to produce high literary quality. The sutra translation was done by expert foreign monk Chinese translators, who did not require interpreter.

Phase III: The approach to translation was largely dominated by Xuan Zang, who advocated attention to be paid to original style. He laid rules for use of transliteration.

The second wave included religious translations by Jesuit Missionaries in the late sixteenth century. Further, they translated jointly with Chinese scholars/officials in the field of Mathematics, Astronomy, Geography, Physics and Religion. In addition, one way translation for the consumption of Chinese people, the Jesuits, and later other missionaries were also instrumental in bringing the Chinese classics and philosophy to Europe.

As the incursions of the European powers grew in early 19th century, Peking sent Lin Zexu to Canton to check these powers, but it did not succeed as there was a need to master their arts. Thereafter, first official team of translators was sent abroad to master English language.

After a series of military defeats, the Manchu rulers found a College of Languages in Peking in 1862 and a bureau in Shanghai in 1865. These institutions

concentrated on technical manuals and Western sciences.

The missionary bodies translated and published works of general educational interest also. As a result, London Mission Press was set up in Shanghai in 1843. The Society for the Diffusion of Christian and General Knowledge among the Chinese, established in Shanghai in 1887 for translation, but their technical books suffered due to lack of expertise.

The third wave was led by native intellectuals and was spearheaded by political reformists - Kang Youwei and Liang Qichao, in place of official or foreign translators, in the field of politics and sociology. This included translations of Western works in 1890s.

Here after, Japanese was preferred over English as the chief source language for translation of Western works, as it takes much less time to acquire elementary understanding of Japanese as compared to European languages.

The reformists helped in the rapid growth of independent publishing houses in the period 1895-1900. Yan Fu contributed in the field of philosophy and social science whereas Lin Shu contributed in the field of fiction. In 1919, Mandarin version of complete Union Bible was also published and Mandarin version became the standard text for Chinese Christians.

The May Fourth movement increased the importance of Western writings in both original and translated forms to install a new culture in China. In 1935, grand plan for a World Library was launched to encompass the ancient, medieval and modern literature of all major countries. The war with Japan in 1937 disrupted this project. Here, individual efforts included translations of all plays of Shakespeare by Zen Shenghao.

In communist regime initially works from Soviet Union were translated. Thereafter, works from Asia, Africa and Latin America were translated into Chinese language along with translation of Chinese works to foreign languages together with foreign experts. The Great Proletarian Cultural Revolution (1966-76) led to an explosion in translation of foreign works in 1980s.


TRAINING

After the establishment of Chinese Republic in 1911, most practitioners were self-trained and there was a lack of fixed policy. Later, government officials were trained. In Hong Kong, the training of simultaneous interpreters began in mid -1970s to cater to the government's bilingual needs. The first university degree -BA in Translation started in 1974 by University of Hong Kong at the initiation of Chinese community.


From above, it is quite clear that the Chinese language has come a long way starting from word by word translation to a meaningful translation.


